#### SBCSELPA EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT TO JPA BOARD

#### October 2, 2023

### 1) Due Process/Dispute Updates -

Seven (7) Due Process filings in progress and one (1) CDE Investigation.

### 2) Non-Public School (NPS) Placement Updates –

We have a total of five (5) SBCSELPA funded NPS placements.

### 3) Special Education Finance Update –

The SBCSELPA Funding Model Committee met on September 19, 2023, to launch off discussions in an effort to build an ongoing funding plan and recommended 2024-2025 funding model to present to the JPA Board in May 2024 (SEE attached presentation from Funding Model Committee meeting – REF: I-F.1).

### 4) Legislative Update -

SBCSELPA continues to monitor two very important proposed bills that support special education:

AB 1517 (SELPA Governance) and SB 354 (Inclusion)

#### 5) State SELPA Due Process Committee -

This committee facilitated a presentation titled, "Due Process Case Analysis: IEE Cost Criteria" (SEE attached Due Process presentation – REF: I-F.2) at our last meeting. Long Beach Unified prevailed on this case and our own Goleta Union School District was commended and acknowledged for their precedent setting win on a similar case several years ago!

#### 6) SBCSELPA Annual Private School Presentations -

The Santa Barbara County SELPA staff held its annual Private School Presentation (SEE attached Private School presentation – REF: I-F.3) in person in locations in both the North and South parts of our County on September 20, 2023. This presentation not only meets Child Find requirements, but is a great way to network with our private school partners!

#### 7) 2023-24 Inclusion Network -

SBCSELPA in collaboration with SBCEO is launching off the 2023-2024 INCLUSION NETWORK countywide! SEE attached Inclusion Network flyer – REF: I-F.4).



No specific methodology for development of cost criteria.

Expertise and exercise of judgment by school authorities should be given deference where District can offer cogent and responsive explanation for its decisions. (*Endrew F.*)

Similar process to A.A. v. Goleta Union School District. No other superseding authority.

No dispute of qualification or experience of evaluators who met the District's cost cap.

Not a lack of qualified assessors willing to do IEEs at District's cost cap.

No unique circumstances.

# DETERMINING MAXIMUM ALLOWABLE RATE: PSYCHOEDUCATIONAL IEEs

### Survey of Assessors

IEE Interest Form sent to approximately 120 independent assessors in and near Long Beach via Google Forms.

Resent form to nonresponsive assessors.

SELPA Provider Criteria follow-up communication sent to assessors via Google Forms, requested required documents.

- Resent Google Forms communication to nonresponsive assessors.
- Followed up with email communication to nonresponsive assessors.

Total of approximately **55 assessors, across disciplines, responded** to inquiry.

- Approximately 30 assessors conducted independent psychoeducational assessments.
  - **26 assessors** requested fees at or under \$5,500.

### Setting Cost Cap

Psychoeducational IEE maximum allowable rate: \$5500.

Excluded outlier rates above \$5500.

Reviewed IEE policies of surrounding SELPAs for reasonable/comparable maximum allowable rates.

Increased maximum allowable rate from \$5000 to \$5500 for psychoeducational IEEs.

Determined reasonable cost cap for IEEs, across disciplines, by excluding outliers on high end of cost spectrum; did not simply average rates of assessors surveyed.

# RATE ANALYSIS — PSYCHO-ED

Student's experts agreed that psycho-ed IEE takes about 20 hours to complete.

### Dr. Simun as outlier:

- Took 11-13 hrs to conduct IEE.
- Costs she identified also impacted other assessors.
- Rate increase from 2021 (\$4,500) to present.

Experts didn't show that cost cap would prevent qualified assessors from conducting an IEE.

# **Consultation Process**

- The Local Education Agency (LEA) / district shall ensure timely and meaningful consultation with private school representatives and representatives of parents of parentally placed private school children with disabilities during the design and development of special education and related services
- SBCSELPA conducts this meeting on behalf of LEAs/districts

# Training & Consultation Process

- Private Schools in Santa Barbara County were sent correspondence inviting them to this training & consultation meeting
- Private school officials were invited to provide input through alternate means (response form) if they are unable to participate in this meeting
- LEA Special Education (SPED) Administrators have been invited to participate in this annual training
- Notice of private school child find is posted on **SBCSELPA** website at sbcselpa.org
- See Section 8 of the Procedural Handbook for more information on the Private School Process.

# **IDEA Child-Find Obligations**

 Each LEA/district, special education local plan area (SELPA), or county office shall actively and systematically seek out all individuals with exceptional needs, including children not enrolled in public school programs, who reside within their jurisdiction

# Child-Find Obligations Cont'd.

Child-find activities conducted by LEAs/ districts for parentally placed private school children shall be similar to those activities undertaken for pupils in public schools

- Informing private schools of the child-find process (this meeting)
- Santa Barbara County SELPA annually publishes in the <u>newspaper</u> a notice regarding Child-Find

# **Child-Find Process for Students** Attending a Private School In Santa Barbara County

- If it is suspected by the private school that a child may have a disability, they should contact the SPED administrator of the LEA/district where the private school is located (DOL). Per agreement with SB County SPED Directors, the DOL will then contact the child's District of Residence (DOR) to make them aware of the information being shared by the private school.
- If the private school is <u>located outside of Santa Barbara</u> County, the request for assessment can be made to the LEA/district where the private school is located (DOL), or if the parents indicate they are interested in the development of an IEP they may request an assessment from <u>the district of residence</u> (DOR). The DOL will contact the DOR to inquire if the DOR would like to conduct the assessment (newly suggested protocol).
- U.S. Department of Education, Office of Special Education

Programs ("OSEP") has provided the following recent guidance: "If the parent requests the LEA of the child's residence to conduct an evaluation for purposes of making FAPE available to the child, that LEA must conduct the evaluation. If the parent requests the LEA where the private school is located to conduct an evaluation for purposes of determining whether the child could be eligible for equitable services, that LEA must conduct the evaluation."

# Child-Find Process In Santa Barbara County Cont'd.

- The LEA/district conducting the assessment (DOL or the DOR) will respond to the parent within 15 days of receipt of the written referral with either an assessment plan outlining the areas to be assessed and the persons responsible or a Prior Written Notice letter denying the assessment and the reasons for the determination.
- If assessment is initiated, the LEA/district conducting the evaluation will **hold an IEP meeting within 60 days** (not counting days between school terms or vacations in excess of 5 days) after receipt of parental consent.

# Child-Find Process Cont'd.

 The private school staff and the parent(s)/guardian are encouraged to conduct a student focused type of meeting within the private school and discuss if other non-special education services are appropriate prior to conducting a formal referral for assessment for special education

# **Determining Eligibility**

- The District of Residence (DOR) will conduct an IEP to determine eligibility for special education unless the parent indicates they are not interested in enrolling in the DOR and want the student to remain in the private school
- Note: to be eligible for special education a student must have a disability that is significant enough that the child requires special education, which is defined as "specially designed instruction" (i.e. services provided by an individual with a special education credential)

# Individual Service Plan (ISP) Process

 After parent consents to assessment, and an IEP meeting has determined that the student is eligible for Special Education as a child with a disability, parents inform the District that they do not intend to place their child in a K-12 public school program, then the District must convene an individual Services Plan meeting to develop a Services Plan.

# **Special Education Eligibility**

- A child with a disability is defined by federal law as a child with:
  - Intellectual disabilities, hearing impairment (including deafness), speech or language impairment, visual impairment (including blindness), emotional disturbance, orthopedic impairment, autism, traumatic brain injury, other health impairment, specific learning disability, deaf-blindness, or multiple disabilities; and who by reason thereof, needs special education and related services

# Individual Service Plans (ISP)

- In order for the eligible student to receive services in the private school, a <u>Service Plan (SP)</u> must be developed for the private school student and consented to by the parents
- The District of Attendance/Location (DOL) where the private school is located is responsible for developing and implementing the ISP.

# Service Plans (SP) & Triennial Reviews

The <u>SP</u> shall be reviewed annually

 A <u>reassessment</u> occurs every three years to determine continued eligibility for special education and appropriate services

# **Private School Provisions**

 A LEAs/district's <u>obligation</u> to children with disabilities enrolled in private schools is limited.

 Under IDEA "no parentally-placed private school child with a disability has an individual right to receive some or all of the special education and related services that the child would receive if enrolled in a public school"

# **Private School Provisions**

 Each LEA / District determines the scope and type of services after consultation with private school representatives (this meeting)

LEA/districts <u>are required to utilize a</u>
 <u>proportionate share</u> of their special
 education federal funds to provide services
 to parentally placed private school students
 with disabilities

# Private School Expenditure Calculation

The amount each LEA/district spends on SPED services for parentally placed private school students with disabilities is formula-driven and district specific.
 The formula derives an average allocation for all IDEA-eligible students with disabilities within Santa Barbara County and multiplies that average by the total number of eligible parentally placed children with disabilities ages \*3 through 21 at private schools within the LEAs/district's jurisdiction

# Determination of Service Plan Services

The how, where, and by whom SPED and related services will be provided to parentally-placed private school children with disabilities are subjects of the process of consultation (this meeting) among SELPA/LEA/District officials, and private school representatives

# Determining Service Plan Services

After this consultation process, the <u>final</u> <u>decision</u> with respect to the services provided to eligible parentally-placed private school children with disabilities is made by the LEA/district

# Disagreement

 A parent of a child enrolled in a private school has the right to file a due process complaint related to the LEA/district's child-find activities

 Because there is <u>no individual right</u> to services for children enrolled by their parents in a private school, any complaints regarding an SP can only be filed in accordance with the California Department of Education (CDE's) compliance complaint procedures.

# Disagreement Cont'd.

A private school official has the right to file a complaint with the State Department of Education that the District or SELPA did not engage in consultation that was meaningful and timely, or did not give due consideration to the views of the private school officials. 

#### Referral for SBCSELPA Wrap Supports

#### Service Description

SBCSELPA Wrap operates as a collection of IEP Mental Health Related services, providing intensive individual counseling, parent counseling, and social work-type supports in various settings, including school, home, and in the community; intended to prevent further restrictive educational placements. Each approved Referral will be assigned a Wrap Facilitator and a Youth Support Specialist to offer support to the student and family for a minimum of 180 minutes per week, for a period of 6-8 weeks; during/after which the IEP team will meet to review progress towards social-emotional/behavior goals, and status of accessing their education in IRE.

- SBCSELPA Mental Health Specialist is available to consult throughout the consideration and development of SELPA28A.
- All SBCSELPA Wrap Support Referrals must be sent to the SBCSELPA Mental Health Specialist and complete this SELPAZBA Referral Process before adding to a student's IEP. Wrap supports added to an IEP before/without an approved SELPAZBA will not be eligible for SBCSELPA-funding/staffing.
- IEP teams are encouraged to consider the appropriateness/need of discussing the intent to submit a SELPA 28A in an IEP meeting/setting (with the family) before initiating this SELPA28A Referral Process—doing so will not impact eligibility for SBCELPA-funding/staffing.

#### Student Population

As a Mental Health support offered through Supplementary Aids, Services, & Transportation, the SBCSELPA Wrap team is staffed to primarily support students who are eligible for Specialized Education under the qualifier of Emotional Disturbance, and who are at-risk of requiring more restrictive educational placements (SDC, GROW, NPS).

Additional consideration and consultation will be required for SELPAZ8A Referrals
made on behalf of students who are eligible for Specialized Education under the
qualifiers other than Emotional Disturbance (e.g., Autism, OHI, SLD, SLI, etc.)

#### Referral Directions

#### **BACKGROUND:**

- This item was presented to the JPA Board as an Information and Discussion item at the August 28, 2023, board meeting. At this meeting it was agreed that this item should be returned as an Action item on the next meeting agenda.
- ➤ Per SBCSELPA Local Plan, Section 5, children with disabilities are entitled to an Individual Education Evaluation (IEE) at public expense.
- ➤ Parents have the right to an independent educational evaluation at public expense if they disagree with an evaluation "obtained" or completed by the LEA. Parent must make a request in writing for an IEE within two years of the date of presentation of the assessment which they disagree consistent with the statute of limitations.
- Independent Educational Evaluations (IEE) are conducted by a qualified examiner who is not employed by the local educational agency (LEA). The LEA either pays for the full cost of the evaluation or ensures the evaluation is otherwise provided at no cost to the parent or guardian. IEE Evaluators must be located within the boundaries of Santa Barbara, Ventura, or San Luis Obispo Counties.
- ➤ IEE Evaluators, yearly, complete a contract with SBCSELPA agreeing to allowable rate ranges proposed by SBCSELPA. SBCSELPA compiles all contracts into a list for LEAs to provide to parents if a request is made for an IEE. The IEE list of evaluators is frequently updated with new evaluator contracts after feedback and approval through the Special Education Administrators Meeting (SEAM).
- ➤ District/LEA business officials and special education administrators agreed upon the proposed rate changes.
- ➤ Attached are the proposed revised Independent Education Evaluation (IEE) rate changes for the 2023-24 school year (SEE REF: VII-A.1).

Reimbursement will be in an amount no greater than the actual cost to the parent and will be subject to proof of payment. When insurance will cover all or partial costs of the IEE, the LEA will request that the parent voluntarily have their insurance pay the IEE costs covered by their insurance. However, parents will not be asked to have insurance cover independent evaluation costs if such action would result in a financial cost to the parents including, but not limited to the following:

- a. A decrease in the available lifetime coverage or any other benefit under an insurance policy;
- b. An increase in premiums or the discontinuance of the policy; or
- c. An out-of-pocket expense such as payment of a deductible amount incurred in filing a claim unless the parent is willing to have the LEA reimburse them for the amount of the deductible.

As part of the contracted evaluation, independent evaluators must:

- attend relevant IEP Team meetings by phone or in person to discuss their findings
- provide protocols of the assessments, and
- provide a written report prior to the IEP Team meeting.

The written report must meet the requirements of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act and California Education Code Section 56327.

The LEA/district shall schedule an IEP meeting within 30 days of receipt of the written report from the IEE assessor.

- ➤ Due to the lack of availability of in-person Speech and Language Pathologists, it has been necessary for the SBCEO to contract with Non-Public Agencies to provide remote Speech and Language services to students in seven of the eight SBCEO preschool SDC programs in Santa Maria and Orcutt. Preschool students require adult support to participate.
- ➤ SBCEO projects that the current preschool classes will be at capacity, 9 students, by 10/31/23. These classes maintain the SELPA recommended staffing guidelines of two paraeducators per class.
- ➤ To meet the needs of the current students SBCEO is requesting an additional (1.5) FTE of paraeducator support for remote speech therapy. This (1.5) FTE will provide two paraeducators at 30 hours per week. This will provide for 9 hours per week of paraeducator support in each SDC classroom.
- ➤ LEA/district special education administrators support the request.

**FISCAL IMPACT:** The estimated cost for the requested two (2) 30-hour paraeducators ranges from \$88,778 - \$131,702 for the 2023-2024 school year.

#### **Background**

Due to the lack of availability of in-person Speech and Language Pathologists, it has been necessary for the SBCEO to contract with Non-Public Agencies to provide remote Speech and Language services to students in seven of the eight SBCEO preschool SDC programs in Santa Maria and Orcutt. Preschool students require adult support in order to participate in remote speech therapy. Therefore, paraeducator support is required to provide effective speech therapy to the students in these classes.

SBCEO projects that the current preschool classes in Santa Maria and Orcutt will have the SELPA recommended number of 9 students per class by October 31, 2023. These classes maintain the SELPA recommended staffing guidelines of two paraeducators per class. The responsibilities of the classroom paraeducators include:

- Student supervision during inside and outside activities
- Implementation of behavior support interventions
- Support of students during center time, snack time, and daily group activity
- Toileting students and changing diapers
- Provide for intervention student safety during escalated behaviors
- Provide assistance to the teacher in preparing learning activities

Preschool students in SDC classes received speech therapy in both individual and small group settings. Small group speech therapy groups are comprised of 2-3 students. When students are removed from the class to participate in either individual or group speech therapy, 6 to 8 students remain in the class. When a paraeducator is removed from the class to support speech therapy, 2 adults remain in the class to support these 6-8 students. This ratio of adults to students does not provide adequate supervision to support the classroom activities and provide for the safety of the students. The classroom paraeducators are required to support daily living activities and behavior. Therefore, an additional paraeducator is needed to support students as they participate in remote speech therapy.

#### Request

This request is for an additional (1.5) FTE of paraeducator support for remote speech therapy. This (1.5) FTE will provide two paraeducators at 30 hours per week. This will provide for 9 hours per week of paraeducator support in each SDC classroom.

#### **Expense**

Expense for two 30-hour paraeducators

She is enrolled in seven general education classes and attends school from 8:30 AM to 3:55 PM. She has been diagnosed as legally blind.

Prior to the 23-24 school year, CM attended Fesler Junior High School in the Santa Maria-Bonita Unified School District. She also required a 1:1 paraeducator to access her education. This paraeducator was provided by Santa Maria Joint-Union High School District.

This year, Santa Maria Joint Union High School District has requested that CR's paraeducator is provided by the SBCEO Itinerant Vision and Orientation and Mobility program.


The SBCEO Vision and Orientation and Mobility program is an itinerant program. It currently serves 137 students ages 0-22 at various schools in Lompoc, Orcutt, Santa Maria Bonita, Santa Maria Joint, Guadalupe School Districts, and Early Start. The program staff includes five 1.0 certificated staff, one .8 FTE certificated staff, and five .75 FTE classified staff. The program's current level of paraeducator staffing is unable to provide the support required by CM's IEP to access FAPE.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

- As per our Local Plan, regional program providers must annually request to continue. and/or add the employment of extra or supplementary support staff that is above and beyond the number of support staff allocated per program or FTE in Local Plan Policy 3204.
- The current Local Plan staffing guidelines for this Moderate Severe Self-Contained program is one (1) teacher and two (2) paraeducators for eight (8) to nine (9) students per half day session. The Alice Shaw Preschool morning program has ten (10) students. One student demonstrates elopement behaviors 4 times a day, this students IEP includes a supplementary aid and service for 180 minutes per day of monitoring elopement, which necessitates additional staffing in the program.
- Lastly, the other nine (9) students in the class have a variety of intensive needs that also require a high level of monitoring including elopement, extreme sensory seeking behaviors, and difficulty participating in directed tasks without a high-level support. To meet the needs of this student in the preschool class classroom effectively the regional program operator, SBCEO, is requesting funding for additional support staff.
- An observation team recently visited the classroom and deemed the request for additional para support necessary as requested.
- LEA/district special education administrators support the proposed plan.

**FISCAL IMPACT:** The estimated cost for requested additional aide support staff ranges from \$28,770.37 - \$42,681.47 for the 2023-2024 school year.

**RECOMMENDATION**: The JPA Board approves the SBCEO Regional Program request for funding of additional support staff for Alex Shaw Preschool for the 2023-2024 school year as presented.

Provide a narrative explanation of the reason for the additional support staff request *(do not use student names; use initials if needed)*:

The SELPA staffing guidelines for the Moderate Severe Self-Contained program is one teacher and two paraeducators for eight to nine students for a half-day program. Currently, the morning session of the Alice Shaw Preschool program has 10 students, one of which demonstrates elopement behaviors four times per day. H.F.K.'s IEP includes a supplementary aid and service for 180 minutes per day of monitoring for elopement, which necessitates additional staffing in the program.

Additionally, the other nine students in the class have a variety of intensive needs that also require a high level of monitoring including elopement, extreme sensory seeking behaviors, and difficulty participating in directed tasks without a high level of support. Three of the students in the class demonstrate aggressive behavior towards peers and staff. Three of the students attempt to elope out of the classroom environment (including outdoors) frequently throughout the day. Three students climb the classroom furniture (tables, chairs and bookshelves) if not closely monitored. These students do not respond when their name is called by an adult. These students require close monitoring and constant supervision in order to keep all students and staff safe and to teach appropriate social skills. When the students become aggressive (hitting, biting, throwing objects, kicking) and/or attempt to elope it requires a staff member to monitor them which reduces the supervision for all the students in the classroom. This intensive level of support needed includes the use of positive reinforcement strategies, tangible reinforcers, visual schedules, and the use of picture exchange communication systems and other forms of Adaptive and Augmentative Communication (AAC).

All the students in the classroom continue to wear diapers (10/10 children) and are being toilet trained. These students require a minimum of one-two daily changes. The high level of staff support during the times of diaper changes also reduces the staff supervision for other students.

The use of evidenced-based practices (EBP) for students with ASD and moderate –severe disabilities have been implemented in the class and students continue to make progress. Successful implementation of evidenced-based practices requires staff training and a high level of planning and organization. This needs to be done regularly and prior to student's arrival in the classroom so that when students are present, staff can fully monitor and support the students, provide the consistency and structured routines and interventions necessary to facilitate academic progress for student while decreasing inappropriate behaviors. Some of the interventions and strategies used include visual schedules, keeping available tangible reinforcers that are unique to each child, cleating lesson activities with modifications and accommodations that are unique to each child's individual developmental needs.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

- As per our Local Plan, regional program providers must annually request to continue. and/or add the employment of extra or supplementary support staff that is above and beyond the number of support staff allocated per program or FTE in Local Plan Policy 3204.
- ➤ SBCEO currently has 15 students who require specialized equipment to meet their orthopedic needs in the educational setting.
- ➤ California Children's Services (CCS) has previously provided physical therapy services to SBCEO to meet these needs. In the Spring of 2023 CCS notified SBCEO that they will no longer be to provide these services due to liability concerns.
- ➤ To meet the needs of the current students SBCEO will require a (0.1) FTE or 16 hours per month of physical therapy services.
- ➤ LEA/district special education administrators support the request.

**FISCAL IMPACT:** The estimated cost for the requested (0.1) FTE Physical Therapy services is \$16,320 for the 2023-2024 school year.

**RECOMMENDATION**: The JPA Board approves the SBCEO regional program request for funding for (0.1) FTE Physical Therapist for the 2023-2024 school year as presented

#### **Background**

Santa Barbara County Education Office (SBCEO) currently has 15 students who require specialized equipment to meet their orthopedic needs in the educational setting. These students require the support of a physical therapist to identify the necessary equipment to meet their needs, fit the equipment to their specifications, adjust the equipment as needed, and provide consultation to SBCEO staff. Historically California Children's Services has provided physical therapy services to SBCEO to meet these needs. California Children's Services informed SBCEO in the spring of 2023 that, due to liability concerns, they will no longer be able to provide physical therapy services to SBCEO students in the educational setting.

In order to meet the needs of students with specialized orthopedic equipment the SBCEO will be required to incur the expense of physical therapy services. The SBCEO will require a (0.1) FTE or 16 hours per month of physical therapy services to meet the needs of current students.

#### Request

This request is for (0.1) FTE of physical therapy services.

#### **Expense**

Expense for the 2023/2024 school year of (0.1) FTE of physical therapy services is \$16,320.

#### Recommendation

The SEAM support and the JPA approve funding for this (0.1) FTE of physical therapy services.

The Santa Barbara County Special Education Local Plan Area (SBCSELPA) is a Joint powers Agency mandated to govern and facilitate special education programs administered by the Local Education Agencies (LEAs)/school districts within Santa Barbara County.

Santa Barbara County Special Education Local Plan Area (SBCSELPA) provides an array of services to the 20 school districts and 4 charter schools throughout Santa Barbara County. These services include the following:

- Oversight and case management for students placed in residential treatment nonpublic schools (NPSs).
- Wraparound social work services.
- Coordination of student mental health IEP related services and NPS placements for LEAs.
- Provides BCBA behavioral consult services to LEAs.
- Provides educational audiologist consult services to LEAs.
- Coordinates with private schools for the support of Child Find and Individual Service Plans (ISPs).
- Allocates funding for special education services.
- Providing training opportunities for LEA staff, parents, and community.
- Allocates and manages low incidence equipment and services funding.
- Develops and governs Local Plan special education policy and procedures for participating LEAs.
- Engages in interagency agreements with agencies such as Tri-Counties Regional Center and California Children's Services (CCS).
- Establishes a Community Advisory Committee (CAC) that advises the governing board and assists in parent and school education.
- Provides Medical Therapy Units (MTUs) for CCS.
- Provides Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) to LEAs/ districts and parents/guardians.
- Provides advisement specific to federal and state special education law.
- Provides advisement from State SELPA.
- Maintains the Local Plan, Procedural Handbook, and website www.sbcselpa.org for Santa Barbara County SELPA.

#### The Law

The Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) and California special education laws guarantee all students with disabilities a Free, Appropriate Public Education (FAPE) in the least restrictive environment. The SBCSELPA and its member districts do not discriminate based on race, color, national origin, religion, sex, or disability in educational programs and activities or employment practices, as required by Title 6 of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Title 9 of the Educational Amendments of 1972, and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973.

#### **Child Find**

Special education programs are available to all eligible students with disabilities, ages 0-22 in Santa Barbara County. The Child Find mandate applies to <u>all</u> children who reside within a State, including children who attend private schools and public schools, highly mobile children, migrant children, homeless children, and children who are wards of the state. (20 U.S.C. 1412(a) (3)) This includes all children who are suspected of having a disability, including children who receive passing grades and are "advancing from grade to grade.

<u>All</u> individuals with disabilities residing in the state, including pupils with disabilities enrolled in Elementary and Secondary schools and Private schools, including parochial schools, regardless of the severity of their disabilities, and in need of special education and related services, will be identified, located, and assessed as required in each district. SBC SELPA, in partnership with the local school districts and county office shall establish written policies and procedures for screening, referral assessment, identification, planning, implementation, review, and three-year triennial assessment for all children who reside in the State of California who are suspected of having a disability. Section 1412 of Title 20 of the U. S. Code.

#### **Behavior Series**

#### **Understanding Brain States & Behavior**

Participants will be introduced to the applied science of brain states and behavior regulation. The goal of this mini-PD is for staff to begin to understand the underpinnings for all human escalation cycles and how "behavior" is not unique to students with behavioral challenges. Staff will be guided through current research on the topic and could participate in activities that help integrate the content that is presented.

#### Supporting Students with Behavioral Needs in School Settings

This introductory mini-PD offers participants a brief overview of traditional vs brain-based perspectives on student dysregulation and challenges staff to reflect on their own narratives about student problem behavior. Additionally, a variety of proactive evidence-based practices for mitigating challenging behavior will be presented and participants will have an opportunity to apply strategies to case-studies in a small group activity.

#### How To "Coach" Students

This mini-PD is focused on practical, hands-on, evidence-based strategies for giving students feedback, offering support, and "correcting" pre-escalation behavior. Staff will reflect on how they like to be "coached" and then apply the scientific information shared to case examples they self-generate. The goal is for participants to walk away with a fresh perspective on how "coaching" vs correcting and/or inadvertent shaming of students could broadly help all the students they serve.

#### Default vs GROW: How our "Lens" Impacts the Way We Support Students

This mini-PD will start with a brief review of brain states and how behavior escalates in all humans, followed by an outline of the differences between "default" vs "GROW" lenses. The objective is for participants to understand what influences our perspectives and responses to student behavior and

how students, especially students with challenging behavior, deserve scientific coaching practices rooted in dignity not punishment procedures.

#### **Data Collection in Special Education**

In this training, participants will have the opportunity to learn about the most common types of data systems used in special education programs (e.g., frequency, duration) and how different IEP goals require different types of data collection. Particular attention will also be given to how to accurately collect ABC data and participants will have opportunities to practice this through case examples and group activities.

#### **Understanding the Functions of Behavior**

The focus of this training will be helping participants learn that behaviors are information and serve several different functions. Once functions are understood then skills can be developed that allow students to navigate through struggles in a more adaptive manner.

#### **Fundamentals of Behavior**

To help educational staff broaden their understanding of "behaviors" in students, this training will introduce them to the science of behavior, including the neuro-biological cycle of behavior that is true for all human beings. Additionally, information related to ACES, trauma, learning challenges, and chronic stress experiences will be presented to help participants examine their own narratives about behaviors in students.

#### **De-Escalation Strategies: Guiding Principles and Next Steps**

In this training, participants will have the opportunity to learn guiding principles for de-escalating students during behavioral/emotional responses and the importance of proactive strategies to mitigate escalation cycles.

#### **SELPA 28: SBCSELPA Continuum of Mental Health Services**

Late in 2020, an Ad-Hoc Committee was formed to revise the SBCSSELPA Continuum of Mental Health. This training is to introduce the new Continuum, discuss its function/limitations, and to provide information on

two added services to the Continuum: Social Work Services and Parent Counseling.

#### **Consulting In Classroom Settings**

The focus of this training will be on sharing strategies that facilitate collaborative and productive consulting in classroom settings. Specific steps and strategies educational specialists (e.g., BCBAs, MFTs, SLPs) can use to build rapport with team

members and establish mutually beneficial communication. In addition, strategies team members (e.g., teachers, paraprofessionals) can also use when collaborating with consultants will also be shared.

#### How To Provide Students with Corrective Feedback & Coaching

This training will focus on how team members (e.g., teachers, paraprofessionals, administrators) can give students feedback, both positive and corrective, in a constructive manner that optimizes communication.

#### **Brain-Based Behavioral Perspectives and Support Strategies**

Drawing from foundations of interpersonal neurobiology, applied developmental attachment, and specific communication skills; participants will gain a functional understanding of how educators can best support students who present with relational and behavioral challenges. Staff will then be able to calibrate their approach to meet the needs of the student as they exist in the moment, supporting emotional resilience and academic success.

Drawing from foundations of interpersonal neurobiology, applied developmental attachment, and specific communication skills; participants will gain a functional understanding of how educators can best utilize relationships with their students to support social-emotional development, academic access, and a culture of emotional inclusion.

Self-Care for Educators provides a time to reflect on your own mental health so that you can more effectively support students. In the course of our work, we are confronted with the challenging aspects of life. As Educators, we are asked to "do more with less," and work within uncertain funding and restrictive policy contexts. The circumstances the youth of today bring to school often impacts not only our teaching but takes a toll on the school. Practicing self-care is an important activity that will help you cognitively, physically, and emotionally "bounce back" each day over the long term.
